

# The Giant Battle Crab

You can resize the files if you want a smaller or bigger sized miniatures in your game, these files are good to 28mm miniatures without changes.

These models that you can see on the next pages were printed at 100-micron layer height, 10 percent infill and 200C with PLA. These numbers may vary based on your printer and the material you use.

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
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**You'll find three folders in this product. They contains the next models:**

**6 parts:** It is good for everyone who do not like supports.

You need support and brim only to the „Battlecrab\_Body\_top.stl”, and you can print the other parts without any additional support. I separated the bottom part of the crab to get a smooth surface. After you cleaned the model from support parts and sanded the stomach of the top body part, you can glue the „Battlecrab\_Body\_bottom.stl” part on it.



The claws are cut into half to print well without support, you have to glue the two half of them together, then to the body. Any type of superglue will do it.

**3 parts:** This folder contains the two claws separated from the body but in one piece. You need support to every part in this folder. Use at least 4-6mm brim around the parts.

**1 part:** The whole model in one piece. You need support to it. It's for those who do not want to glue the parts together just hit the print button on their printer, remove support and use the model. Use at least 4-6mm brim around the parts.

**Arrow and spear:** you have to print three arrows and one spear that you can place in the holes of the bigger claw of the crab. Check out the pictures for reference. Use at least 4-6mm brim around the parts.
