


NOVELTY CARDSTOCK GAMING AIDS 1 OVERVIEW



This set contains an assortment of gaming aids. Why? Well, I thought it would be funny to offer a fully downloadable set of game components, and I decided to start with some of the most generically useful items.

Standing Flame Markers: These fold up into an inverted "T" shape. Use them to mark areas, vehicles, or figures that are on fire. Because they stand up rather than being flat tokens, they look a bit more visually interesting on the tabletop, and are easier to pick up.

7-Inch Movement Ruler: The ruler is a double-sided fold-over. I included it for the fans of gridless layouts.

Scatter Marker: Double-sided fold-over. To use it, orient the arrow in the direction of the attack, then roll a six-sided die to determine the direction of deviation. To find the distance that the attack deviates, roll another die.

Cardstock 6-Sided Dice: Basic box fold. I can't think of a serious reason to actually use those instead of the real thing, but they're lots of fun and have character of their own.

Blast Templates: All of the round blast templates are contained within a frame. Cut around the frame, score it along the middle, then fold and glue the template together. Trim off the whitespace with scissors or a knife, and you're done. You can also cut out the hole in the middle to make positioning it easier, and the best way to do that is to first slice the hole into triangles like a pie, then shave off the triangles one at a time. The small template covers a 2x2-inch area, the medium template covers a 3x3-inch area, and the large template covers a 4x4-inch area.

Jet Templates: All of the teardrop-shaped jet templates are contained within a frame. Cut around the frame, score it along the middle, then fold and glue the template together. Trim off the whitespace with scissors or a knife, and you're done. The small template covers a 1.5x4-inch area, the medium template covers a 2.25x6-inch area, and the large template covers a 3x8-inch area.
