






E-Z HEROES allows you to convert old boxes into stunning city terrain for superhero miniature games or modern timeline RPGs. Plenty of bricks, windows, doors, business signs and more are included so no two buildings will ever look the same!






1: Select the style of building material you want from the various brick and concrete selections in this set. Cut pieces to the dimension of the box you have selected and glue. You have the option of printing these items on cardstock and gluing or using blank self adhesive paper available in any office store (the example here is cardstock and glue.)




2: Once you sides have been glued and dry, cut a section of rooftop and apply to the top of the box. Don't worry if it doesn't quite touch the edges as that will be corrected in the next step.




3: Cut a strip of edging the width of your building and apply. It is important that the upper portion of the strip overlaps the roof portion (see above and right.) If you are using adhesive paper go ahead and fold, if not, allow the lower portion that is glued to the building side to dry first.




4: Once dry, fold over so the edge strip overlaps the roof piece you applied in step 2. Repeat for all four sides.



5: Once the roof edging is dry, you must decide if you want your building corners to simple be the brick you selected or the more ornate style. Either selection will be applied the same way as in step 6.



6: Cut a corner piece out and hold it up to your building. Make a pencil mark where it meets the roof edging and trim the excess off. Glue into place (a very thin white line in the center is on each piece to help in proper alignment with the corner of the box.)



7: Repeat for all four corner edges and allow to dry.



8: After you finish with the corners it's time to apply windows, doors, awnings and signs to dress up your building. A wide variety is included in this set and future sets will offer even more options.
