

Tools and Materials

Grave Robbers Donkey Cart

For assembling the cart I suggest the following tools and materials.

Print out of the model set on thick card, I recommend Matte Photo Paper.

Glue stick. I recommend glue sticks, they are clean, easy to use, are tacky for quick assembly, and dry quickly. They do dry out over time, but you can seal the tray with clear spray acrylic paint to protect and make the tray more durable.

White glue. I also recommend white or liquid craft glue. This is good for gluing small parts or edges of parts together. Liquid glue tends to warp, so don't use it on large areas.

Hobby knife. If your blade is worn or dirty, change it. Using fresh and sharp blades will make your cutting easier and more consistent.

Metal ruler. This will make it easier to cut and score straight lines.

Tweezers. These are optional, but do help with squeezing the short tray sides together after gluing.





Scoring & Pre-folding

Scoring and pre-folding the tray will make it much easier to assemble. Score the folded lines marked with the red lines ending with the small circles.

Once the fold lines are scored, cut the parts from the page. With the parts cut, pre-fold all of the fold lines. This means to just fold over the fold lines on each other and crease them. This will weaken the fold, and make these very thin sections easier to glue in place.

Once the parts are all cut and pre-folded, your ready for the next step.




Glue Rails and Wheels

Flip the cart over to the blank side. Fold over side rails and the two inside wheel sections. Apply glue to these sections and press them down to glue them in place.

*Edging helps hide the white edges of the paper model when it is finished and give the model a cleaner look. You can use any soft tip marker and run it along the edges of the exposed paper edges. In this example I have edged all of the sides so you can see the parts more clearly.


When the parts are firmly glued into place you are ready for the next step.



Assemble inside of cart bed

Flip the cart over with the printed side facing up. Fold UP the front of cart, and the two sides, then fold in the two tabs over the front of cart. Glue the two tabs to the front of the cart.



Once the glue is firm, you are ready for the next step.



Assemble outside of cart

Fold the cart front and side section down as shown in photo. Note that I have covered the corners with black marker to help hide the corners.

Glue each side over the inside section. When the glue is firm, you are ready for the next step.



Assemble the cart bed underside

Flip the cart over so it is upside down.
Fold over the underside section of the cart
bed, and glue into place. When the glue is
firm you are ready for the next step.



Assemble Donkey strap

Fold each side of the down at about a 45 degree angle. Glue the tab under the opposing strap section. Once glue is firm, you are ready for the next step.



Assemble seat and foot boards

Fold each part over and glue back to back.

Once dry, glue to cart with liquid white glue on the front section of the cart as shown in the photo. Place the lighter colored sides upward. Once dry, the cart is finished and ready to add the driver.



Assemble cart driver

Glue the driver back to back with the entire line of figures per the instructions for assembling the figures. Cut away the driver and save for assembling with the cart.



Score the rear of the driver on the score lines shown as red lines. Once scored, go ahead and trim the figure out with your craft knife as you would with any regular figure.

Edge the figure with a black soft tip marker. When the figure is completely cut out and edged, flip the figure onto its back. Carefully bend up the legs and arm as shown in the photo. I suggest edging the scored lines on the rear of the figure if they appear white. You are now ready to add the figure to the cart.

Glue the figure to the cart in the seated positions as shown in the photo. When the glue is dry your cart is now ready for the Donkey!



Donkey Cart finished!

The Donkey figure is assembled using the instructions from the figure set page.

The Donkey cart is now finished. The cart does not need to be glued to the back of the Donkey figure, it will rest on it's own.

That's it! You now have a Donkey cart to haul around all those dead corpses. Fun. JIM
