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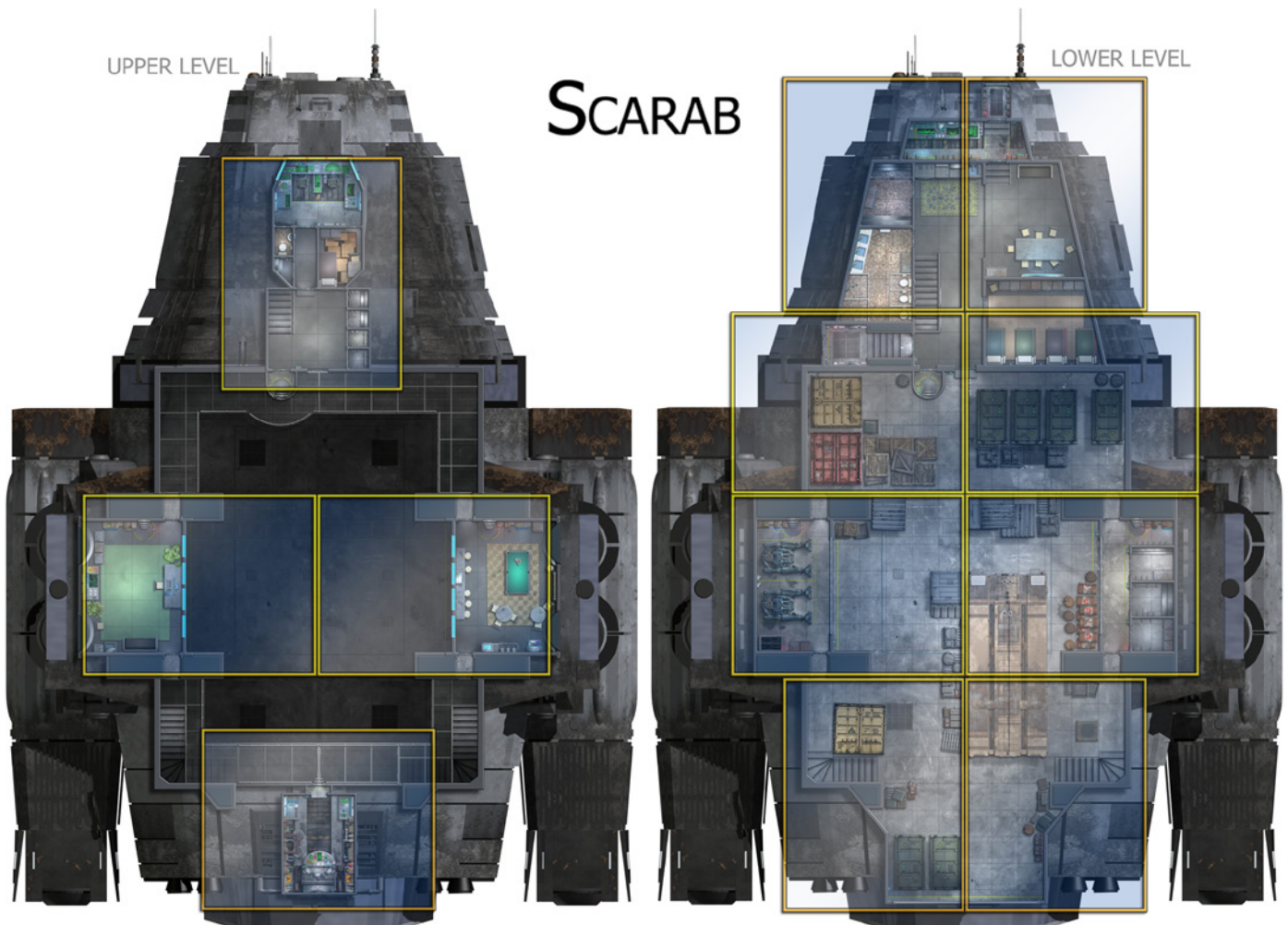
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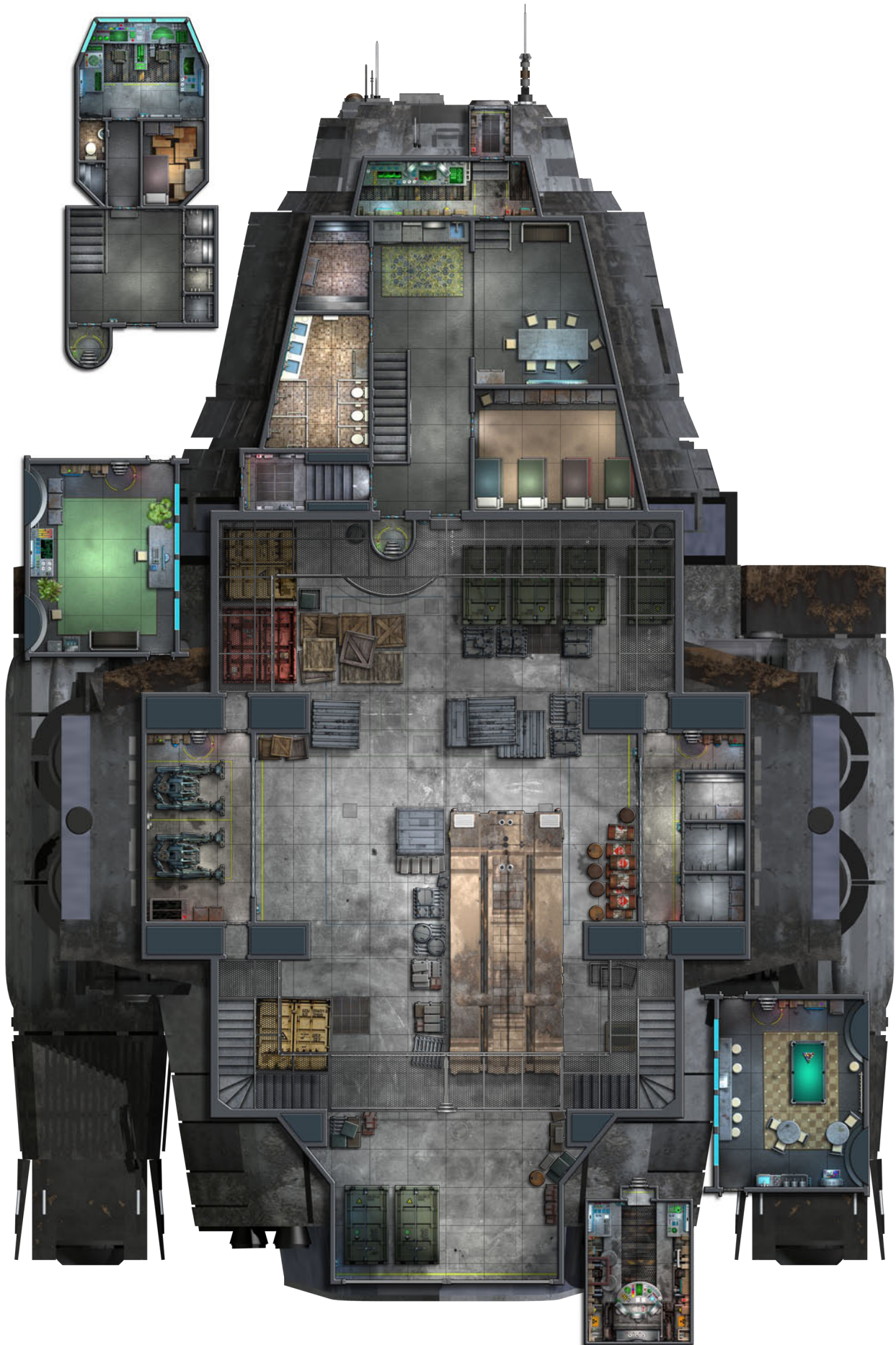
This document contains the deckplans for the ships broken into pages. They can be printed out, trimmed, and placed end to end to map out the habitable locations of each vessel. This file was constructed using layers to allow for some customization of display. The layers are:

- Balcony: the catwalk around the perimeter of the cargo hold.
- Optional items such as cargo and carried vehicles.
- Grid: 1 inch grid, with each square representing 5 feet.
- Black & White version of the primary map elements.
- Ship: an exterior view of the ship under the map.
- Background image with the primary map elements.

The Scarab class freighter is displayed first - with four pages for the upper level and eight for the lower, then the four extra pages needed to construct the longer Kiboko-class are presented. The Balcony layer can be turned on or off depending on whether a given page is used to represent the upper or lower level.

The following images show how the map pages are laid out for each ship. Note that the red-framed pages are the ones used exclusively by the Kiboko. All of the other pages are used in both classes of ship.
