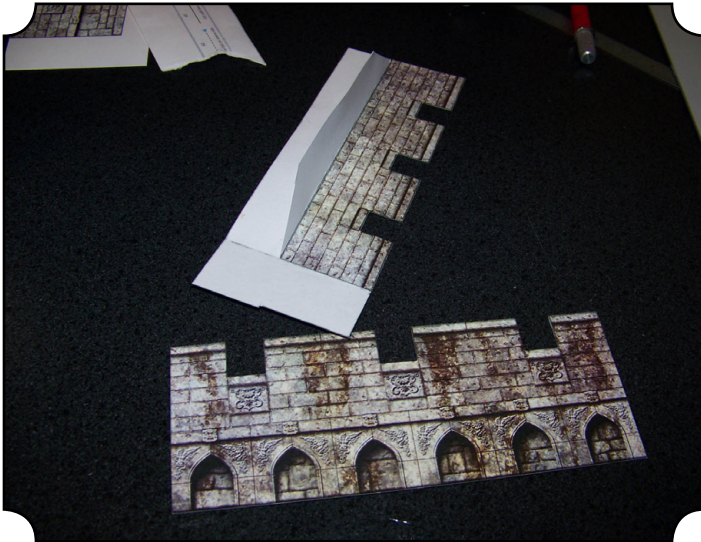

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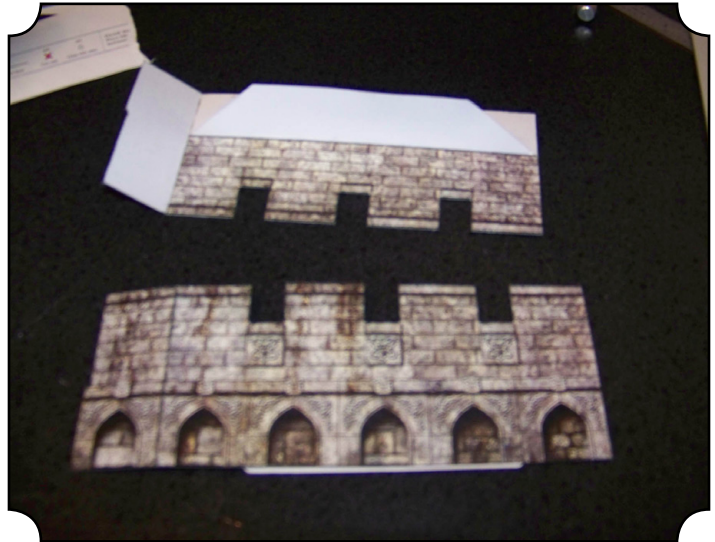
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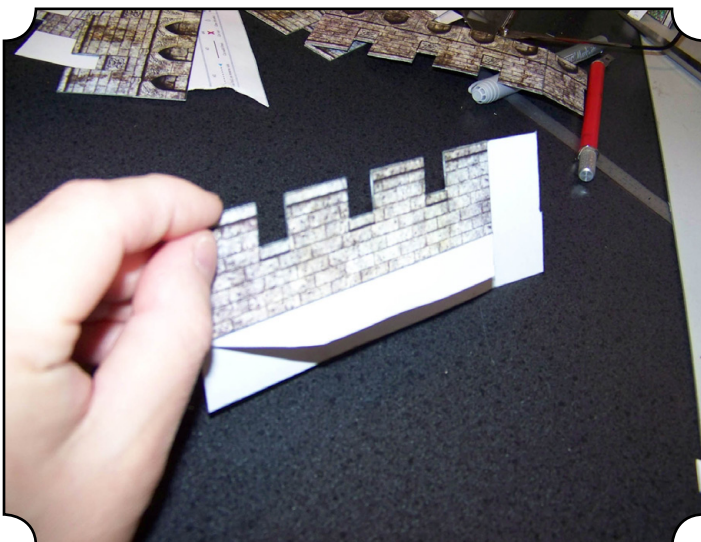
TOWERS



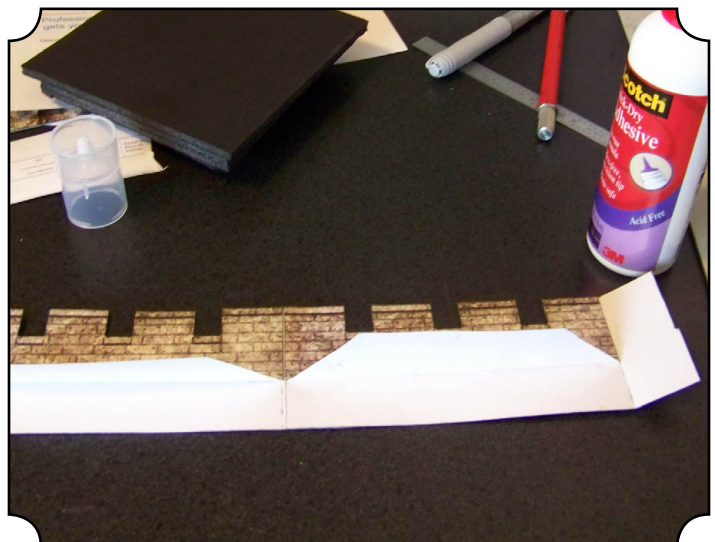
1: Cut and test fold the crenelation pieces as shown above. We recommend not cutting away the spaces between the crenelations until after the piece has been glued in half.



2: Glue in half, being careful not to glue the interior tab for the floor section (large white tab.)



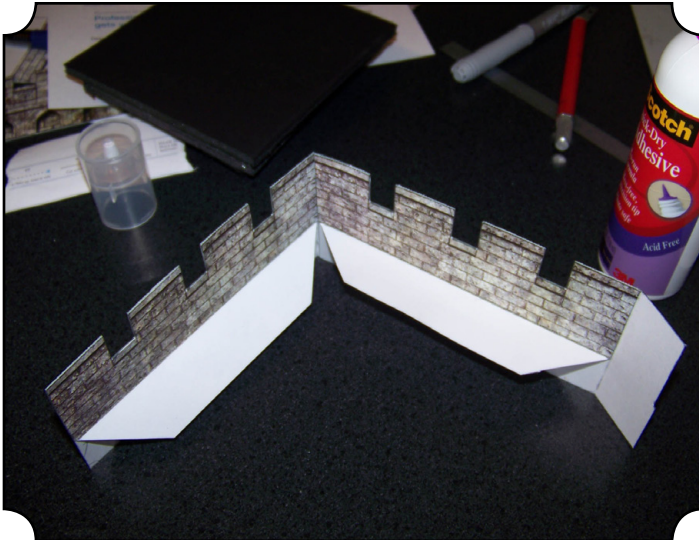
3: Here is another view of the interior tab folded outward into position.



4: Begin gluing the four crenelation sections end-to-end as depicted above.

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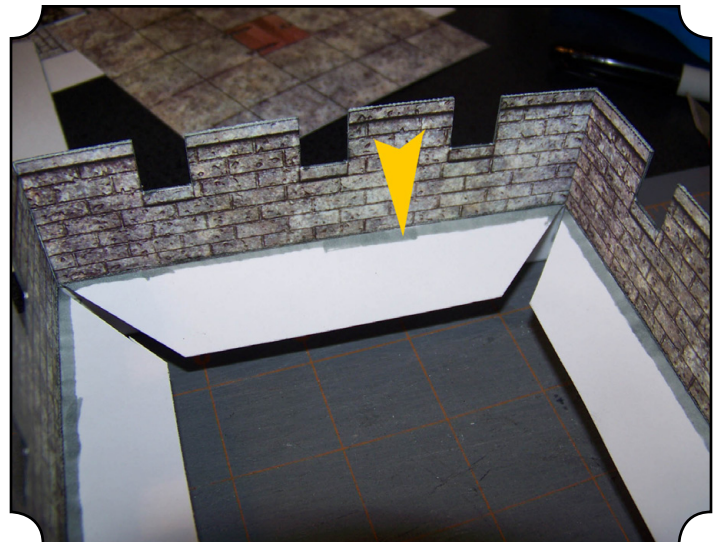
5: Here is what the sections will look like when glued together.



6: To glue the floor piece into place, we recommend building a support first which will allow you to apply proper pressure while the floor dries. Cut a large square out of thick cardboard or foamcore 5"x5", then build up one side with scraps that are smaller until it is approximately 1" tall.



7: Here is the assembly from the top view.



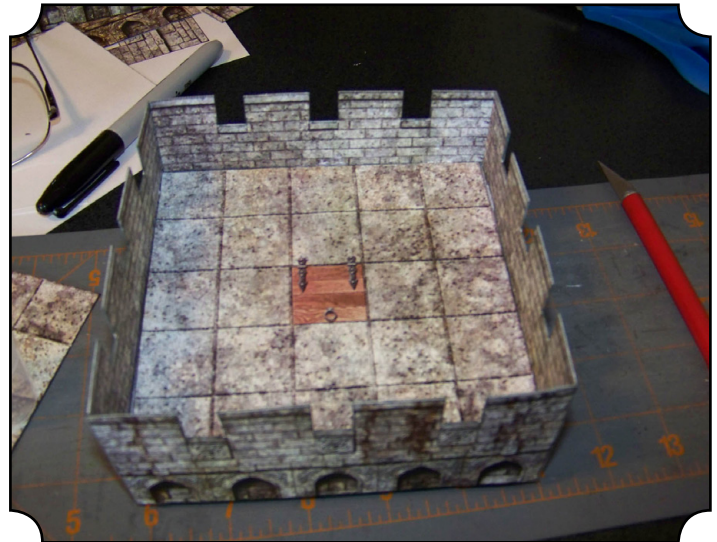
8: Edge the tab where it meets the crenelation with a gray or black marker (this way if there is a gap with your floor piece no white shows through.)

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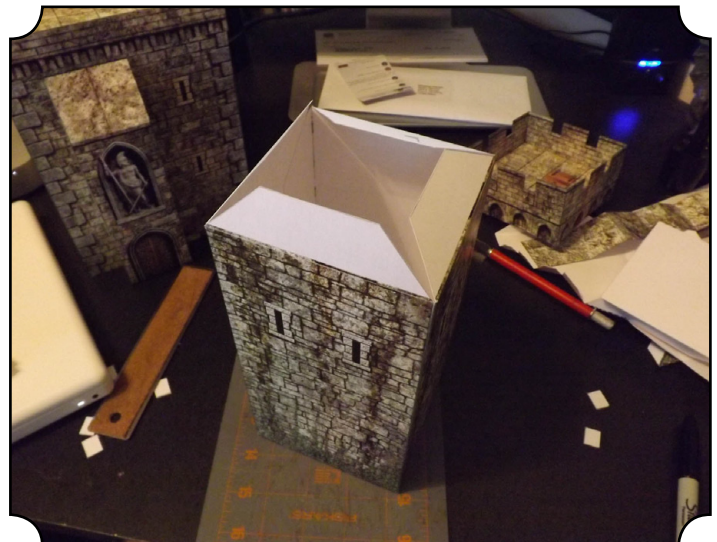
9: Place the crenelation model over the support.



10: Glue the floor section into place, applying pressure in all areas against the interior support you built. Remove the support when finished.



11: The tower walls are simply made of four pieces glued together. If it is to be a corner tower, glue two door sections in a row, then two window sections. Glue all four sections into one long piece and allow to dry.



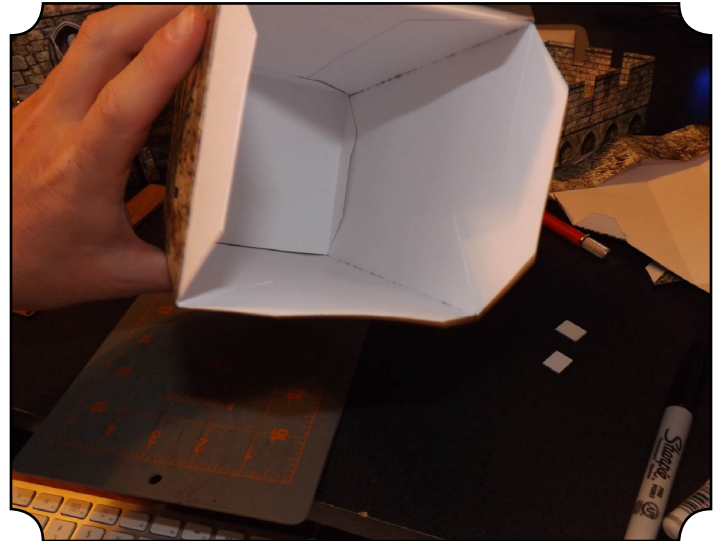
12: Glue the completed strip ends together and form the final square shape of the tower.

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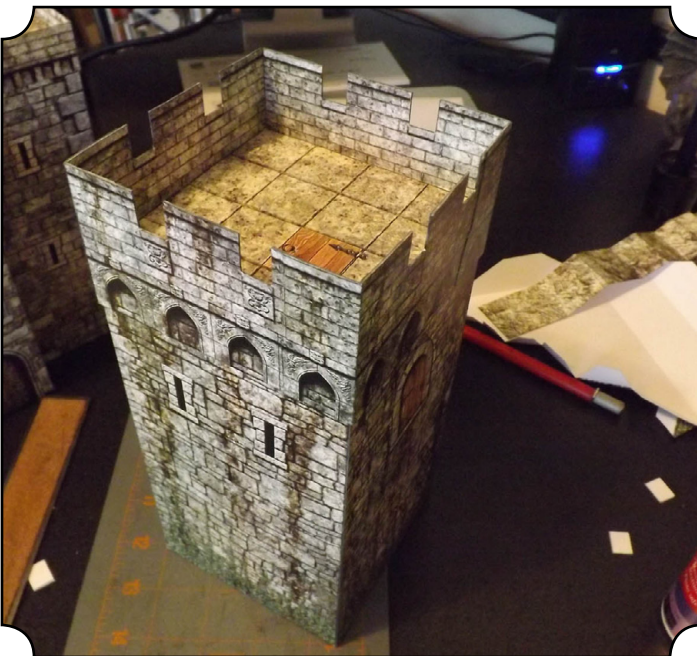
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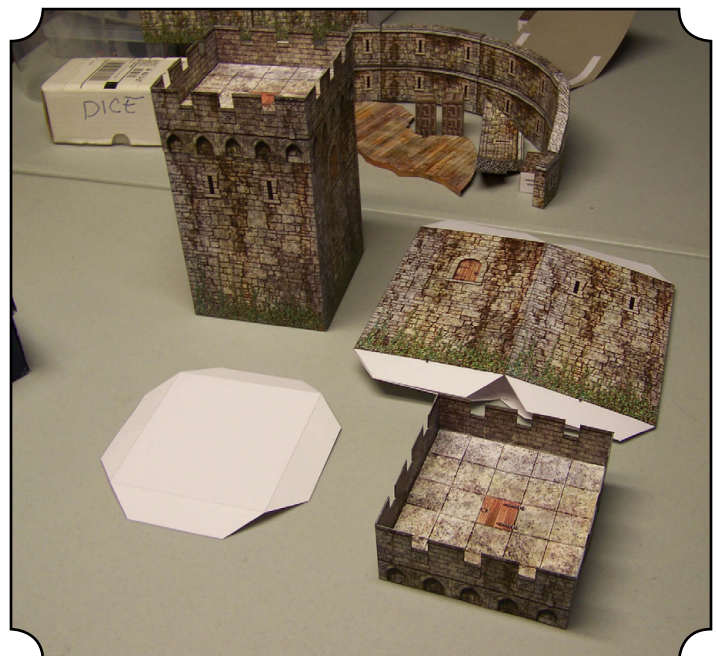
13: Cut and score the interior brace piece. This then is inserted (without gluing) through the top of the tower and is slid to the very bottom. This will keep your tower rigid while being used, and then when removed allow the tower walls to fold flat.



14: Here is the brace in place at the bottom of the tower.



15: The final tower with crenelation cap in place.



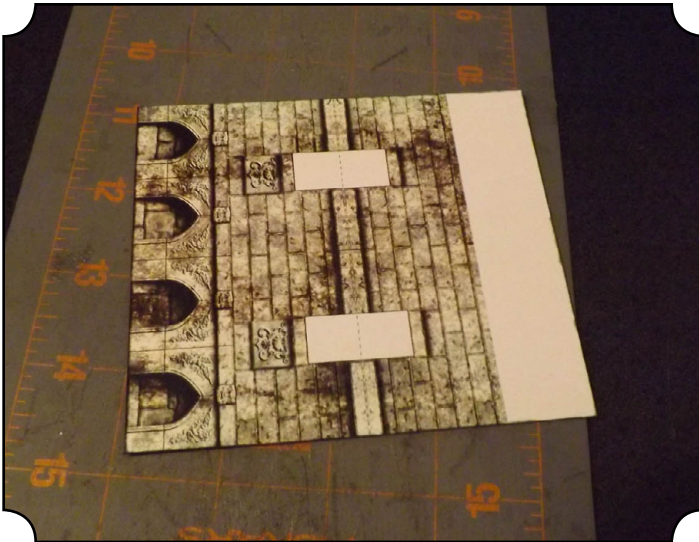
16: Here is a completed tower folded up and one fully assembled.

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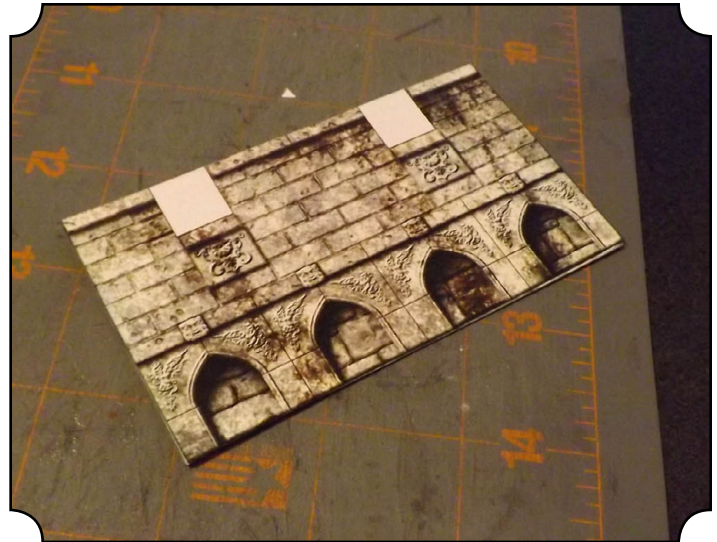
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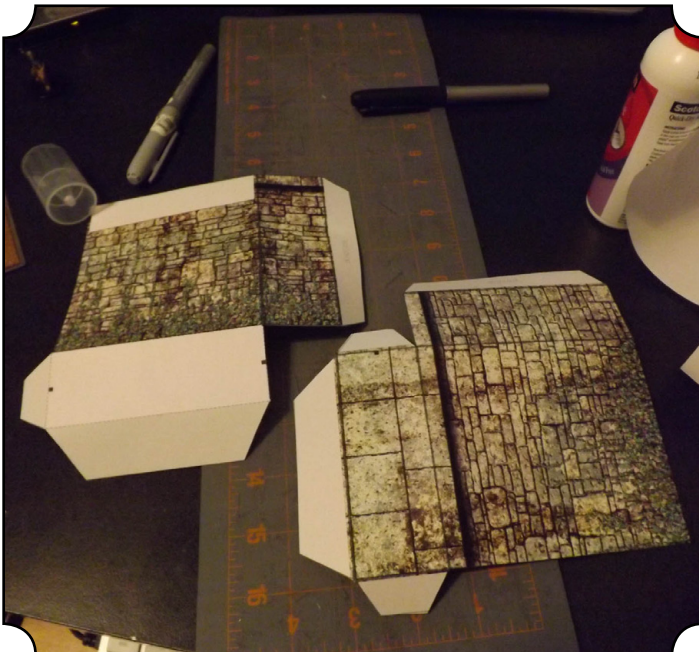
WALLS



1: Cut and score the top crenelation piece.



2: Glue in half and allow to dry.



3: Cut and test fold the wall pieces.



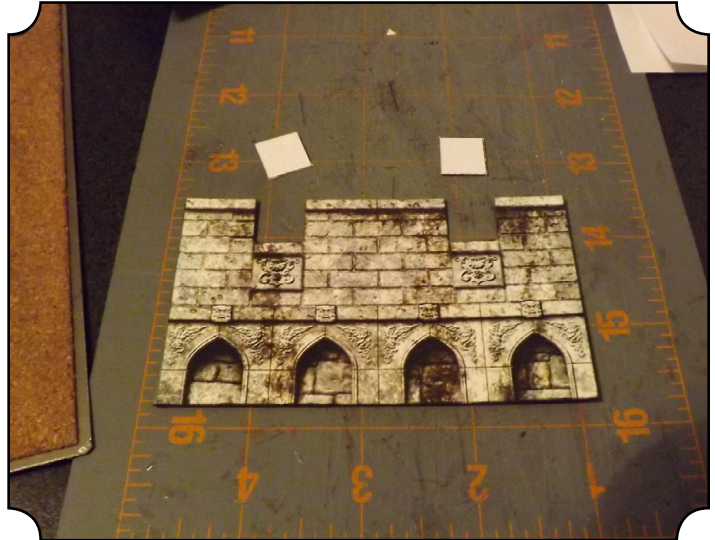
4: Glue the top edge tab and allow to dry. Note the small black squares, cut these out so you can connect walls to each other using bobby pins.

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5: Glue the lower tabs and set aside to fully dry.



6: Cut out the crenelation gaps.



7: Glue the crenelation piece to the front of the wall. **DO NOT GLUE THE WALL SIDE FLAPS!** These stay shut with friction, and must be free to be opened up so your wall can be stored flat when not in use.



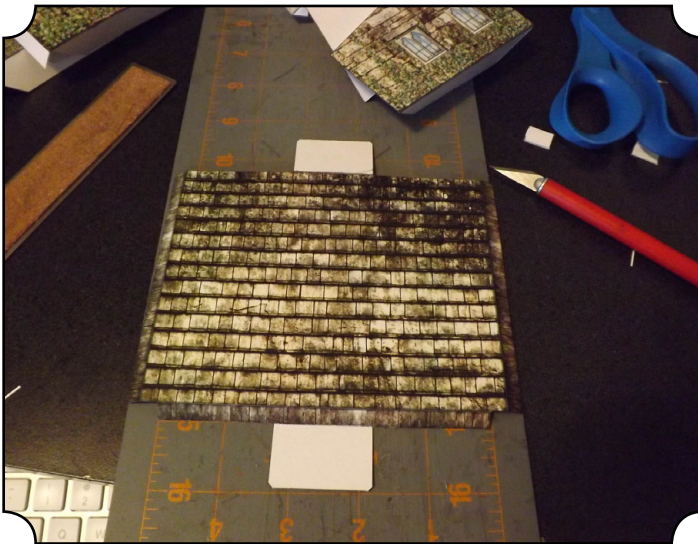
8: The finished wall.

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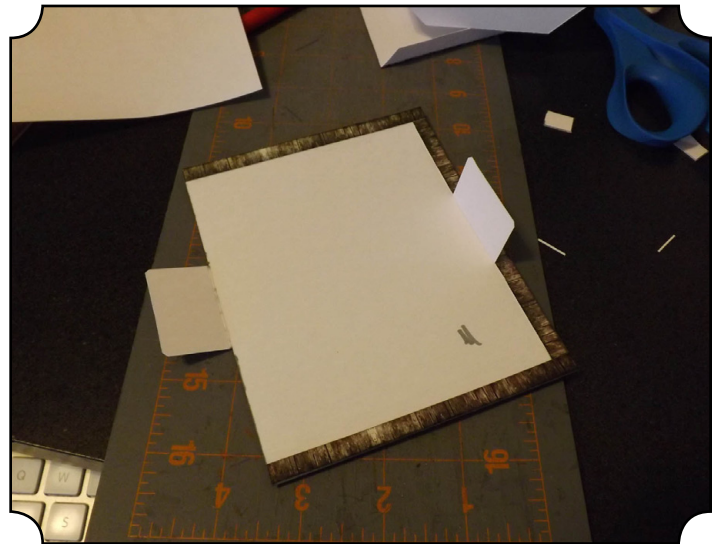
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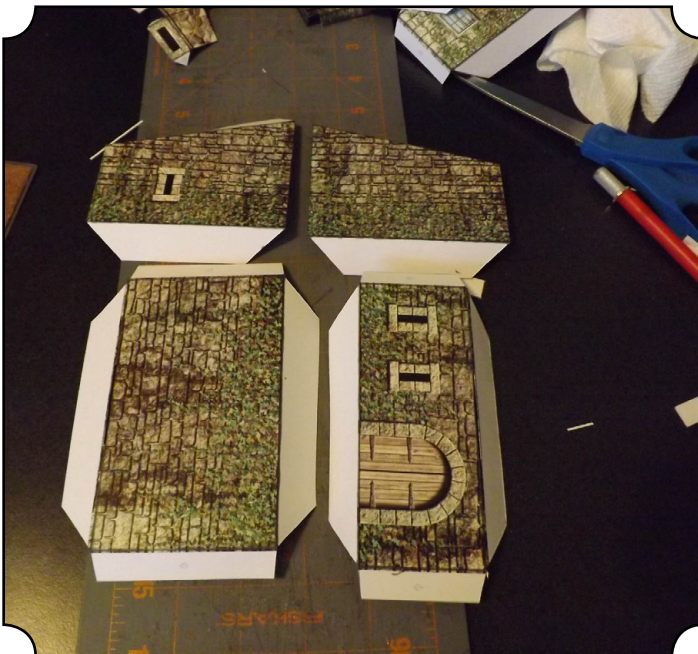
INTERIOR BUILDINGS



1: Cut and score the roof as shown.



2: Glue the edge flaps as depicted and allow to dry.



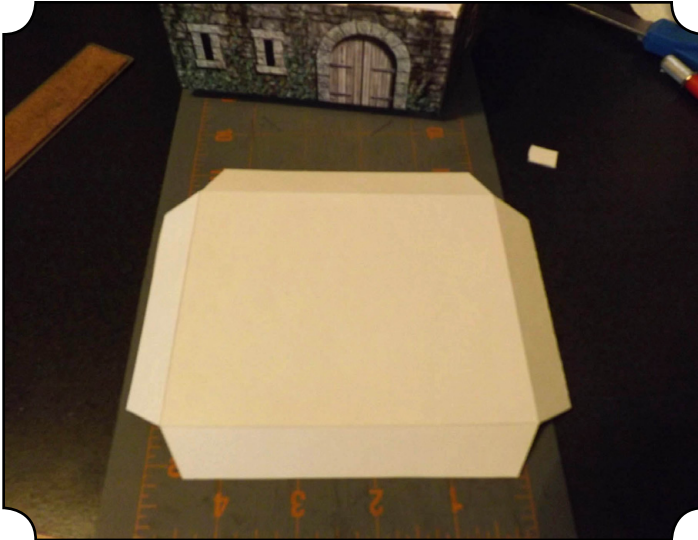
3: Cut and score the wall pieces.



4: Glue all four sections into one long piece and allow to dry. Then glue the last remaining tab forming the final box shape.

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5: Cut and score the interior brace.



6: Insert this brace (without gluing) through the top of the building and is slid to the very bottom. This will keep your building rigid while being used, and then when removed allow the building walls to fold flat.



7: This view shows the brace in place at the bottom of the building.



8: The building with the roof in place.

9: Cut and score the chimney.



10: Glue the side tab.



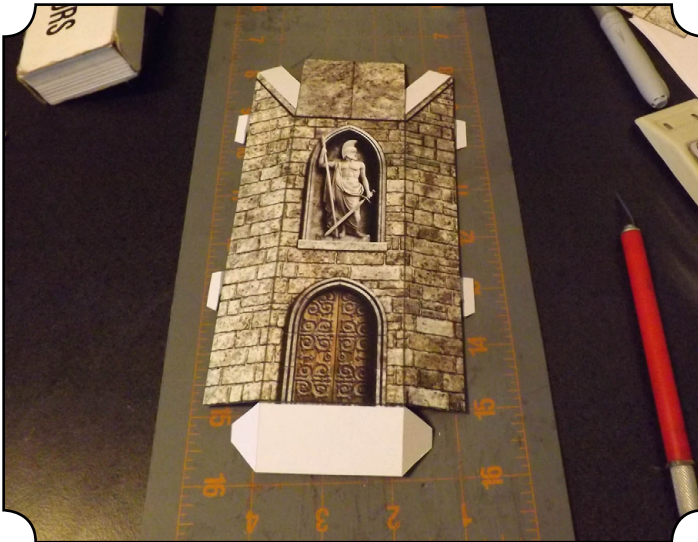
11: Glue the top flap.



12: Insert through the attachment slots in the roof.

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13: The large building assembles just like the tower models. The only exception is the entrance. Cut and score this piece.



14: Glue the four tabs and allow to dry.



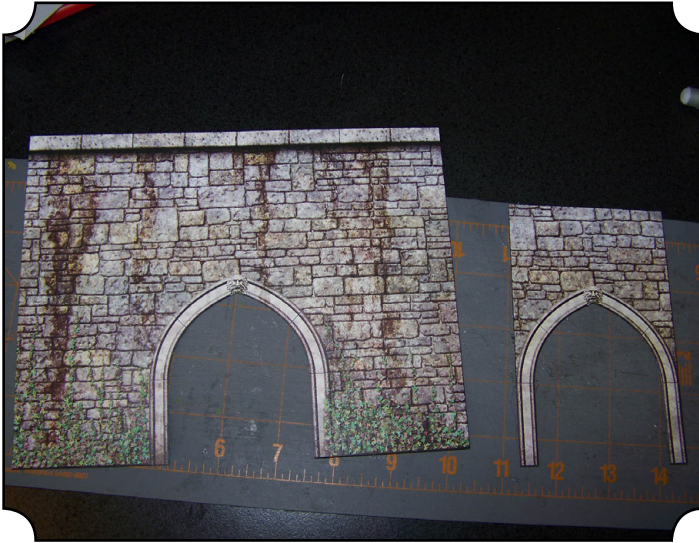
15: The entrance simply attaches using the slots cut into the front wall of the main building.

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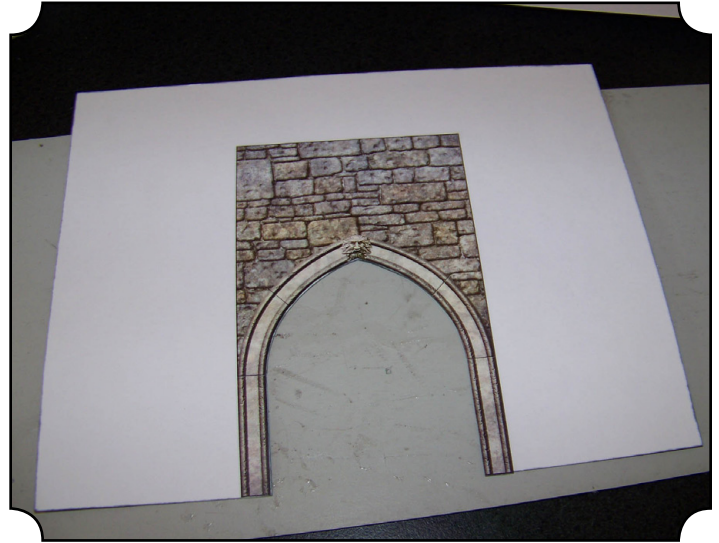
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GATE



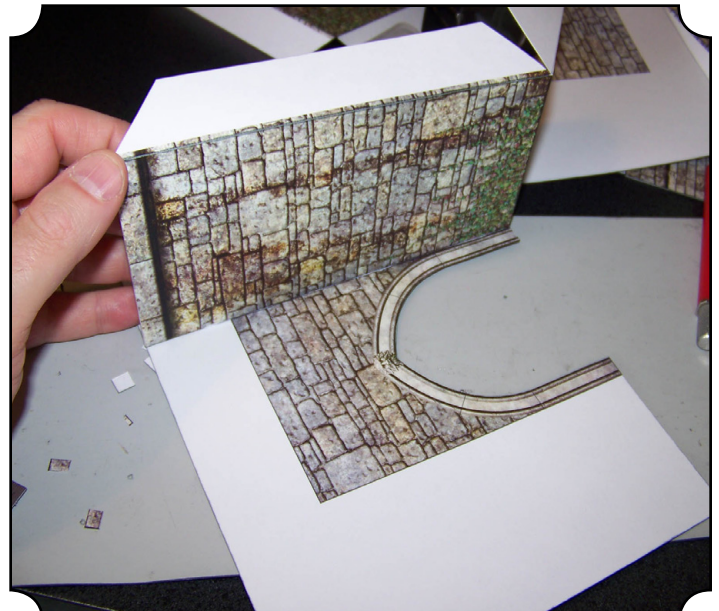
1: Cut the exterior and interior wall faces out.



2: Glue the two pieces together.



3: Cut out the interior side walls.

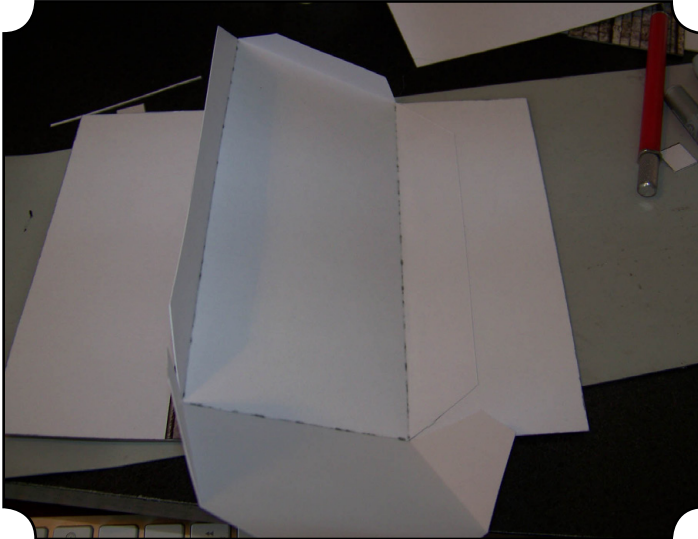


4: Glue to the inside face of the front wall. Do not glue to the upper area that is white.

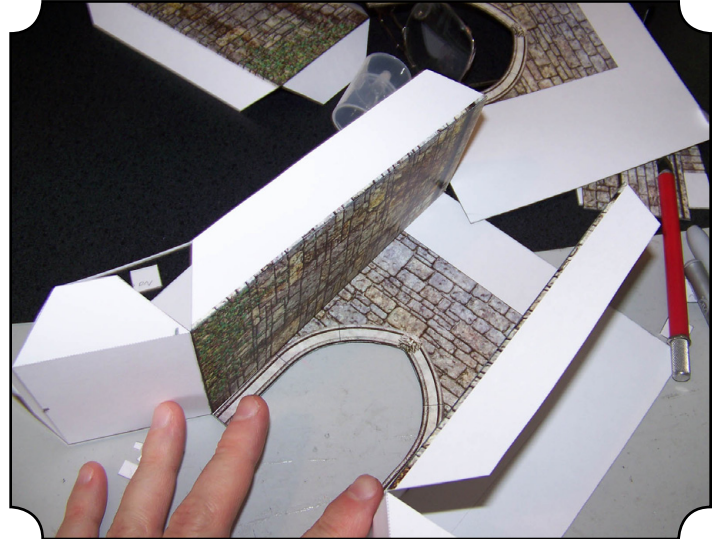
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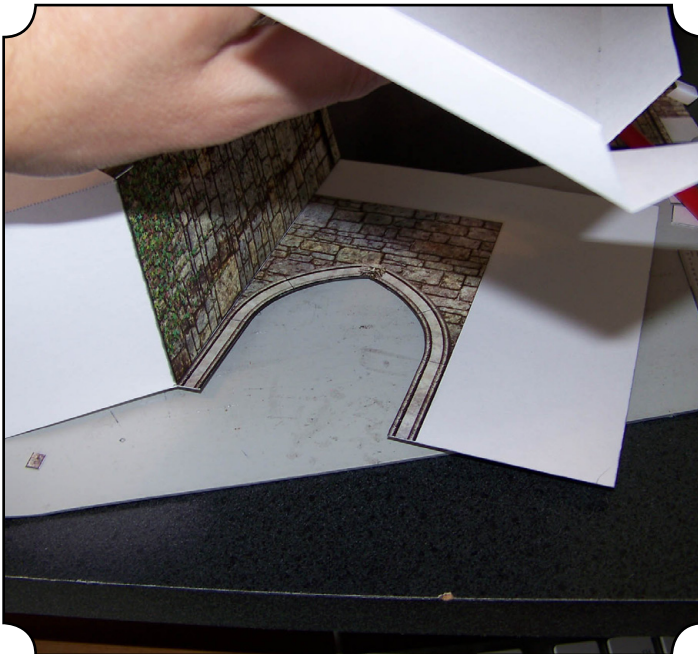

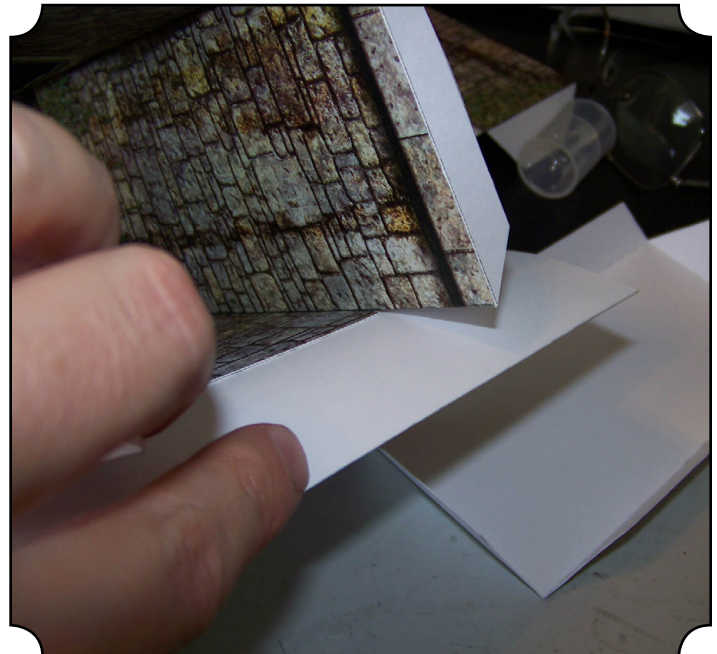
5: Another view of the interior side walls attached.



6: Here is a view of both walls attached.



7: Another view.

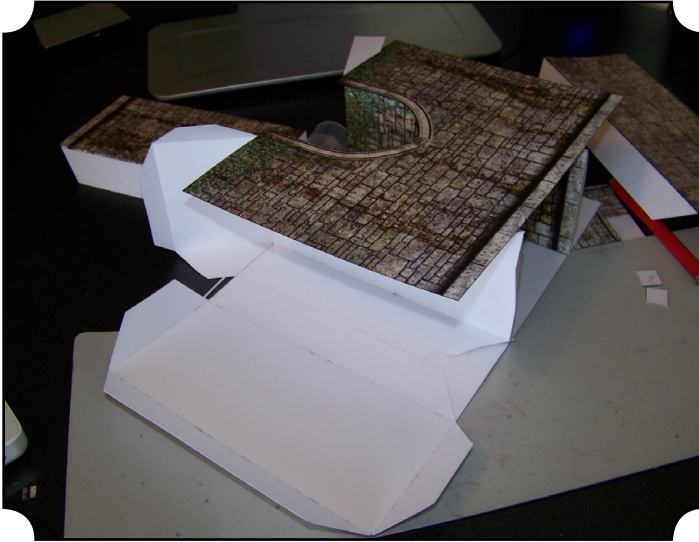


8: Make sure you do not glue the interior side wall tabs to the inside front wall in the upper white area (this is being bent back to demonstrate what is not glued above.)

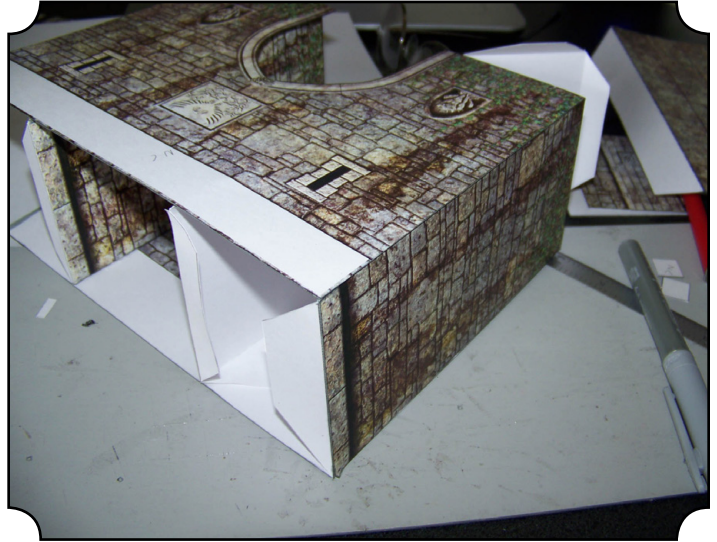
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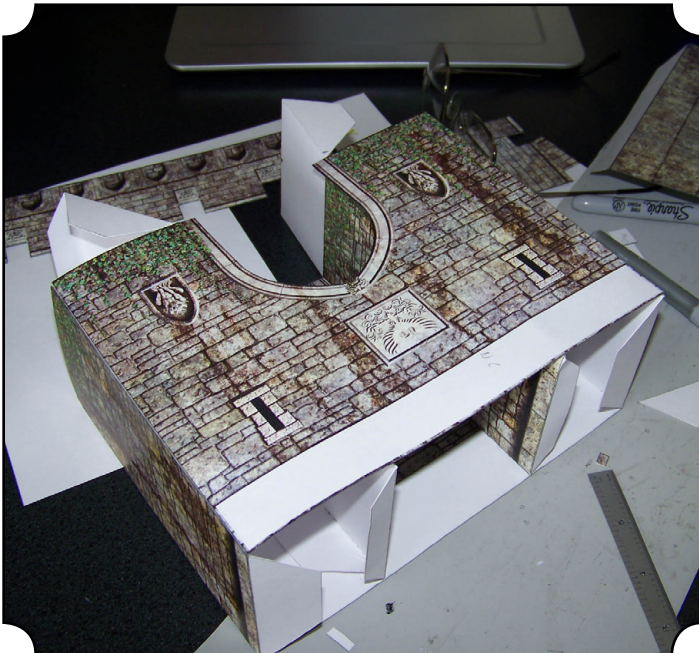

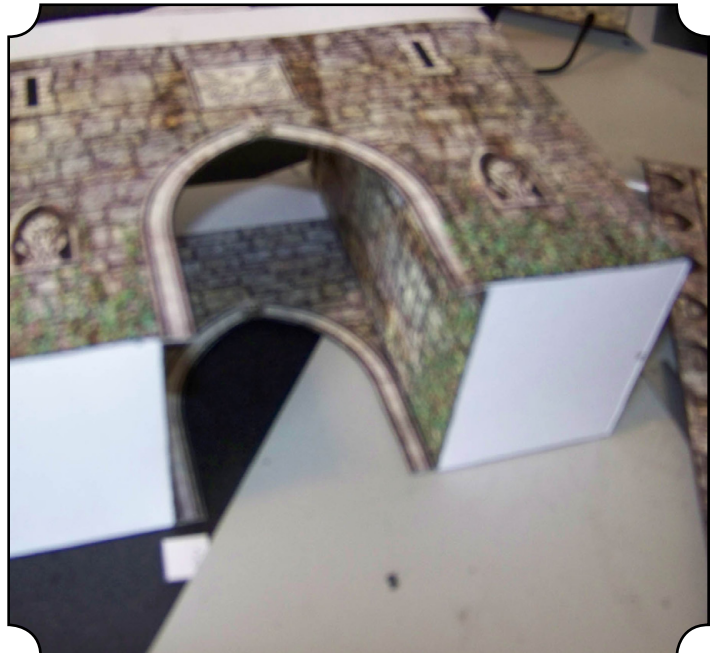
9: Glue the opposite front wall section into place and each outer side wall pieces.



10: Finish gluing the outer side walls.



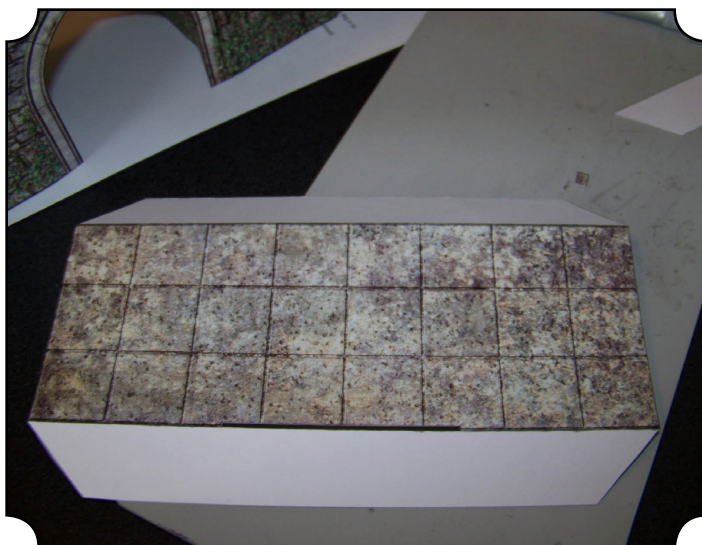
11: Make sure all seams are glued inside and nothing has popped loose as the next steps are to seal the gate house up.



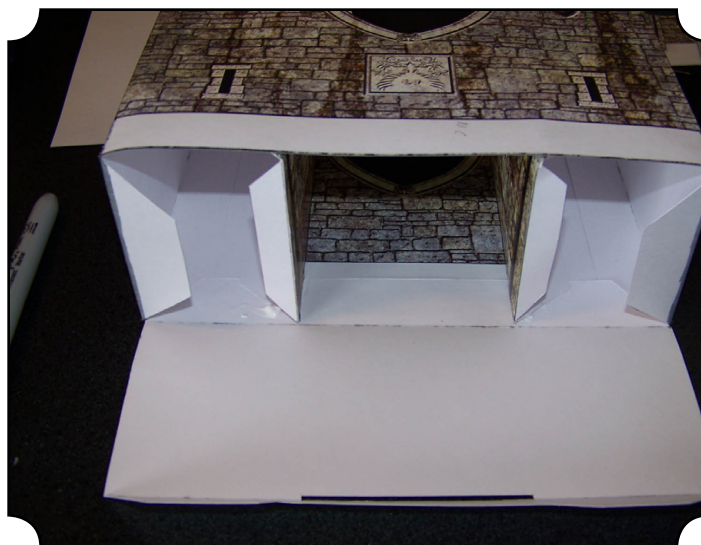
12: Glue the bottom flaps into place.

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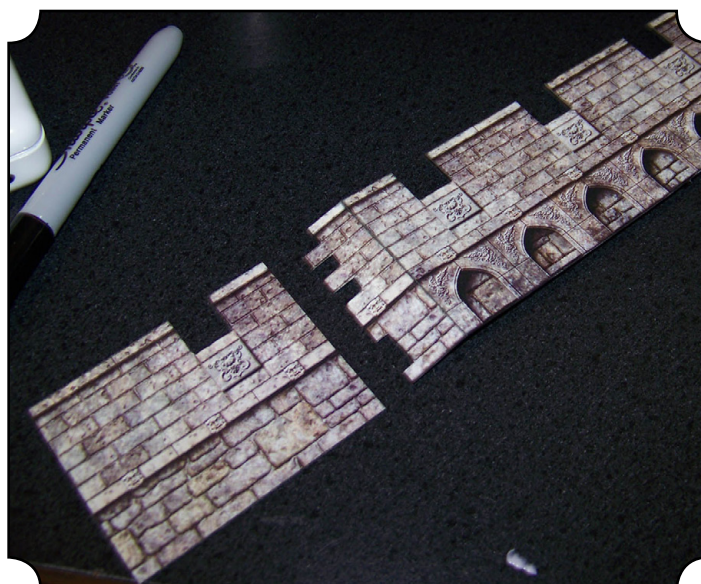
13: Cut out and score the roof piece. Note the slot along the front edge, this is for inserting the open and closed portcullis pieces (these simply fold and glue in half to assemble.)



14: Glue to one side of the gate house. Note that this tab slips between the front wall and the upper portions of the tabs for the interior side walls (this is why you didn't glue them all the way to the top). If you did accidentally glue them to the top, just cut small notches into the roof tab to make room for the side walls. Make sure the slot for the portcullis is toward the FRONT wall of the gate house.



15: For the side tabs of the upper crenelation strip, you can hide the seams much more effectively if you cut the ends along the natural breaks between the bricks.

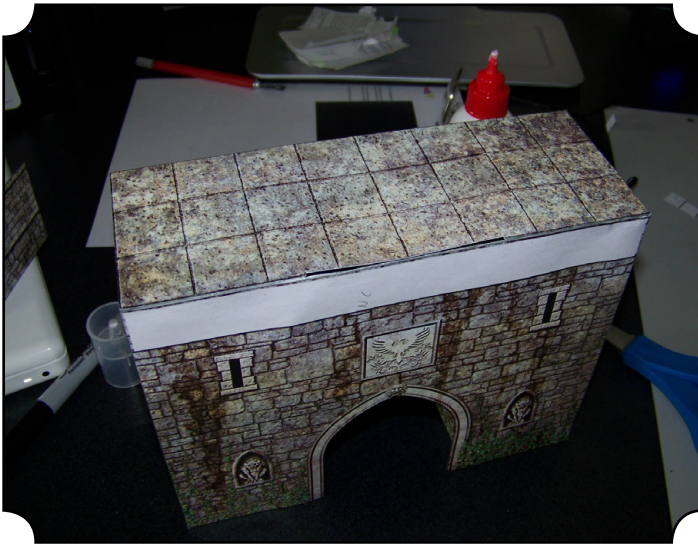


16: Glue the front crenelation section to the side pieces as depicted above.

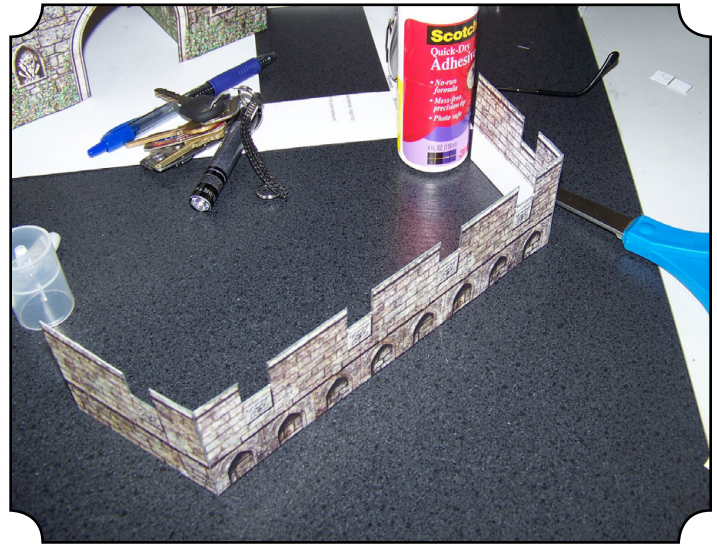
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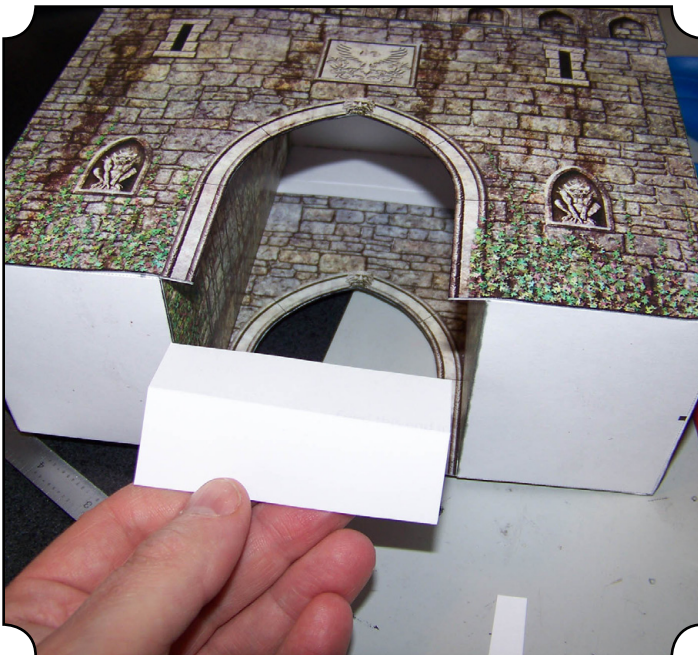

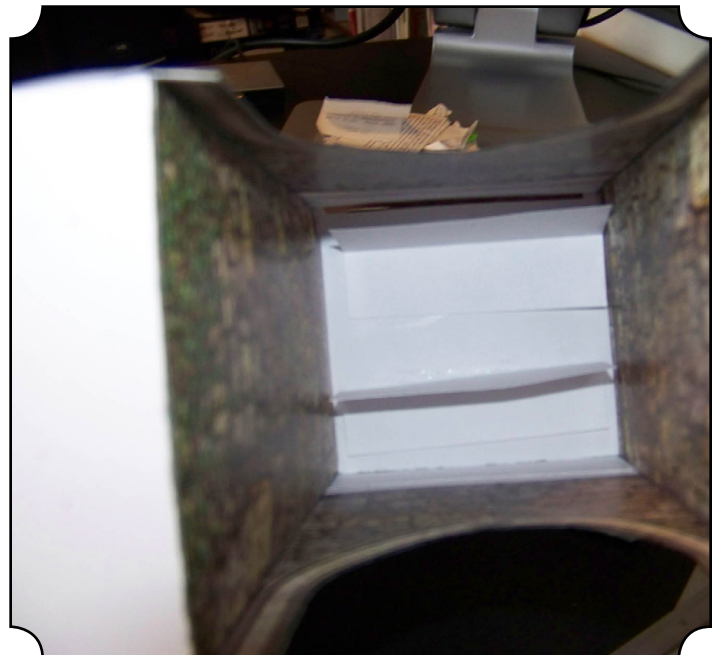
17: Here is a view of the completed main gate house model with roof piece in place.



18: The finished crenelation strip with sides attached. Glue this to the completed gate house model.



19: The two interior braces are designed to keep your roof from bowing when miniatures are placed on it. Fold them into a 90° angle and apply glue to ONE HALF OF ONE SIDE ONLY.



20: Glue them to the interior face of the roof as shown, spaced roughly equally apart (exact placement is not critical) with half of each one angled down at approximately a 90° angle to keep the roof rigid and from bowing.

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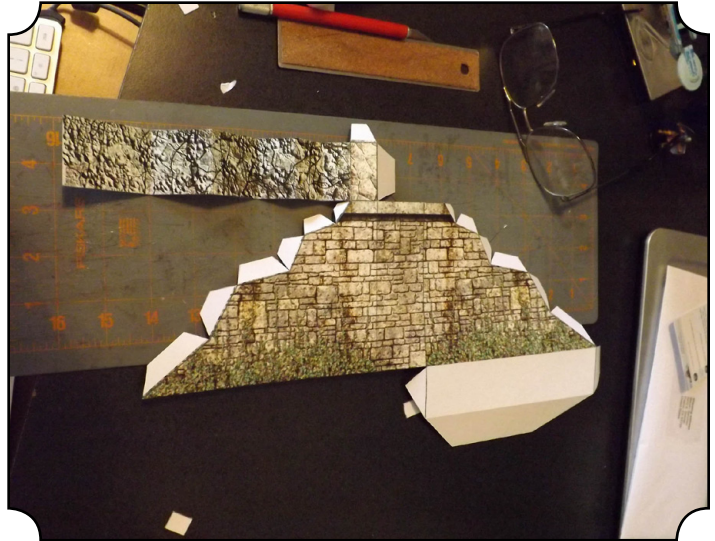
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RUINED WALL



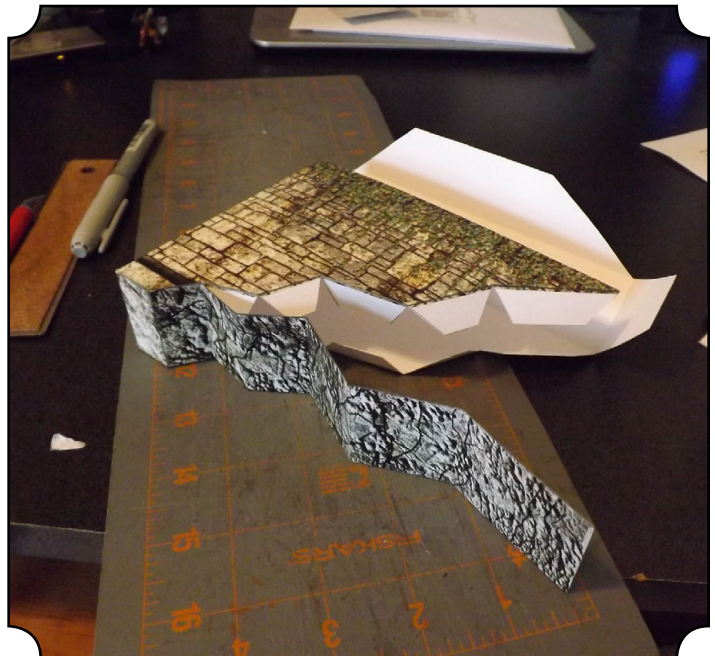
1: Cut and score the ruined wall pieces.



2: Glue the rear side ends together.



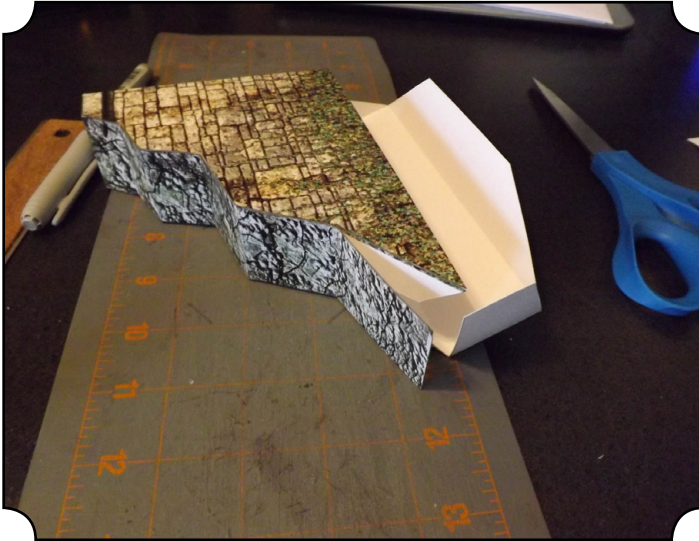
3: Begin gluing the broken top edge one set of tabs at a time starting at the top.



4: Continue gluing down the length, allowing each set of tabs to properly dry.

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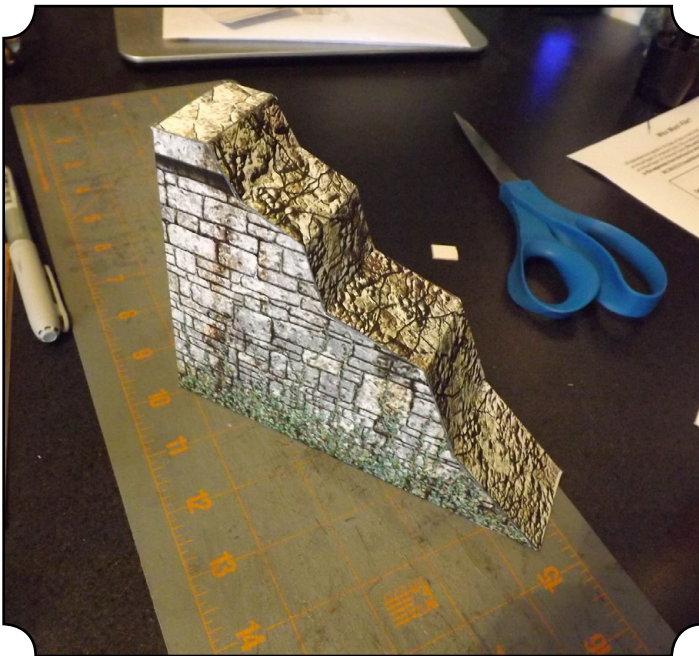
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5: Let each set of tabs fully dry before proceeding to the next. To save time, it is advantageous to be working on several models at once, so while one is drying you can be working on another.



6: Next glue the bottom flap into place.



7: The completed wall.

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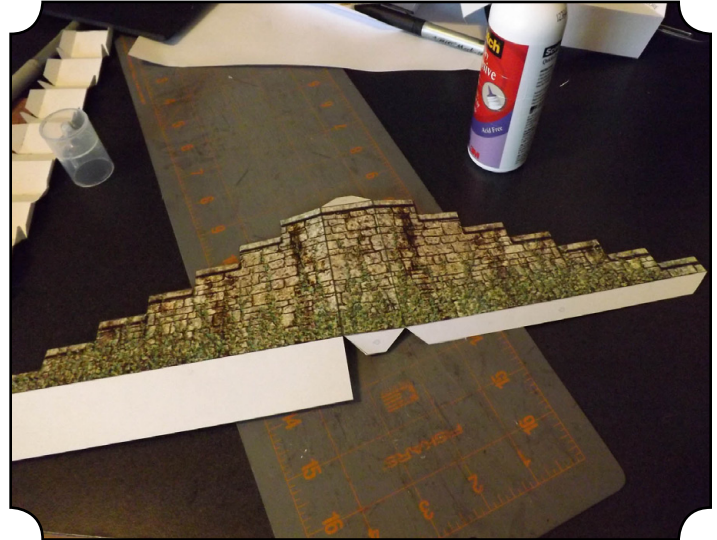
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STAIRS



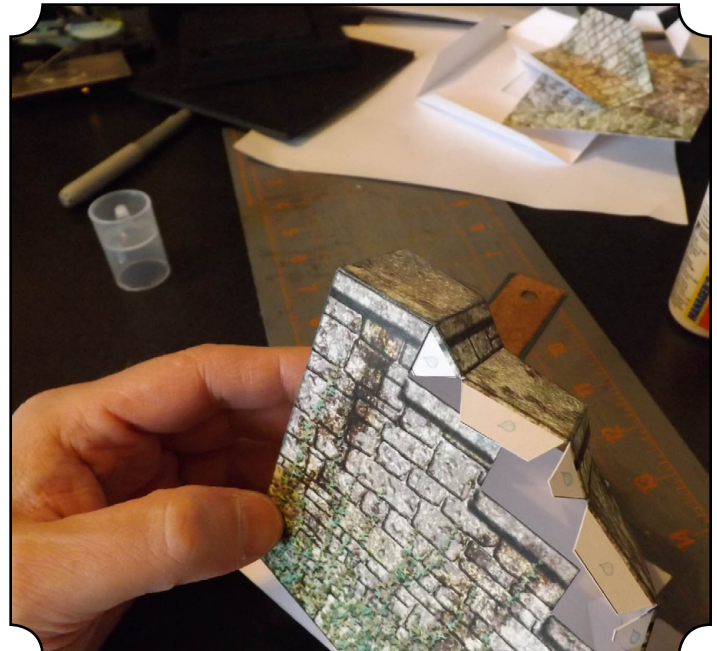
1: Cut and score the three pieces for the stair model.



2: Glue the side walls together along their rear edge seam.



3: Glue the stair tread piece to the very top of the wall sections.



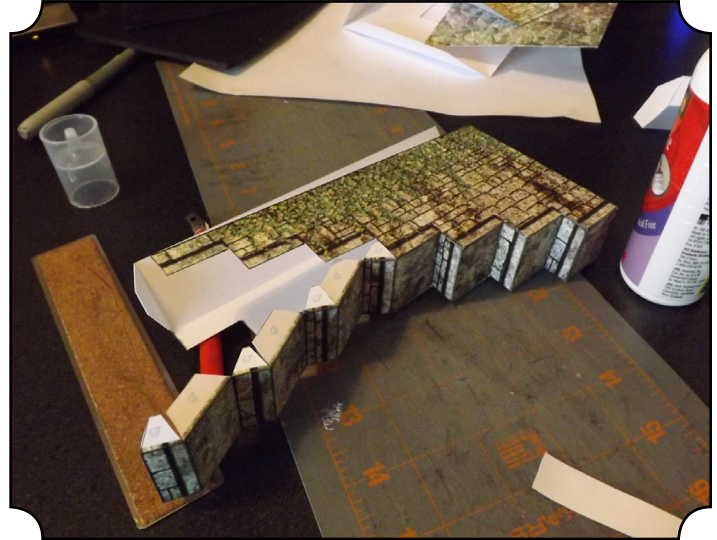
4: Begin gluing the stair treads one set of tabs at a time, starting at the top.

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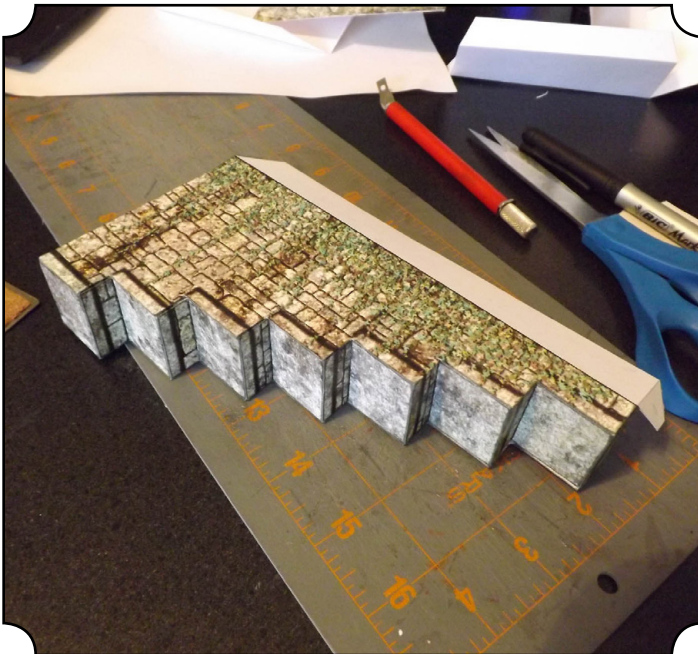
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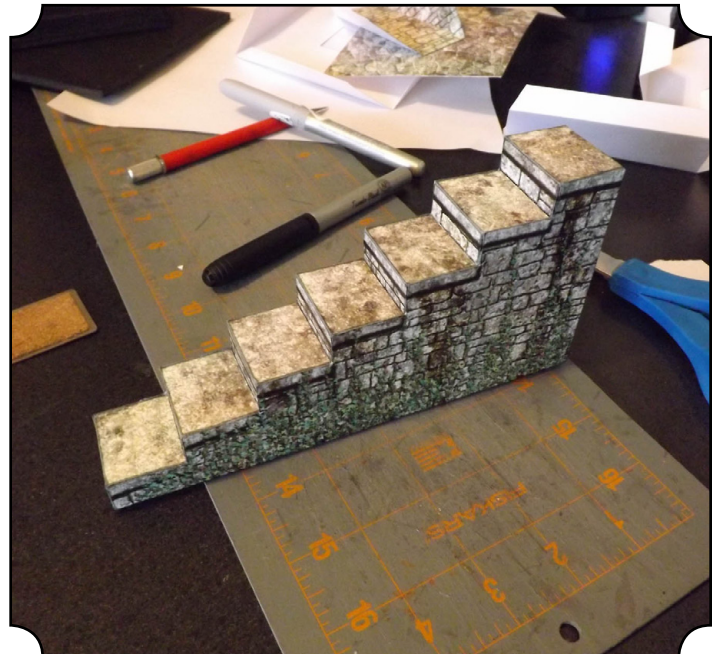
5: It helps to use a small ruler or other long instrument to apply pressure to the tabs as they dry.



6: Continue down the length of the center strip, gluing one set of tabs at a time.



7: After the stair tread is glued into place, finish by gluing the bottom flap.



8: The finished stair model.
